

HIGH VOLTAGE SAFETY DEMONSTRATION

Is it safe to touch a ladder or a person that's in contact with a power line? Why can birds sit on power lines and not get hurt? Why do we have to keep our kites out of the power lines?

These and other questions are answered at our electric safety demonstration. Employee volunteers built the High Voltage Safety Trailer, which is used to demonstrate the dangers of contacting overhead and

underground electrical lines and electrical equipment attached to those lines.



On October 30th qualified UCEMC employees visited Defeated Elementary School with our High Voltage Safety Demo trailer. The children witnessed the flash of an electrical arc, electrical faults and other dangerous situations, and how to avoid them.

Our demonstrations are excellent for schools, civic groups, and for fire and police departments.
